5.2 Item 15: **Toivo Pinnacle**: An undersea pinnacle located on Fairweather Ground in the North Pacific Ocean; named for Mr. Toivo Mathias Andersen (1910-1991), a pioneer salmon-trawler on the Fairweather Ground. Approved at ACUF 261 (2/7/1995)

7.1 **Dowd Guyot**: An undersea tablemount located southwest of Mexico in the Pacific Ocean; Dowd was a graduate student who lost his life on an expedition in the area. Approved ACUF 133 (1/14/1972)

7.3 Palmer took an action to research the origins of the name **Columbia Seamount.** No information found. The name was approved by ACUF at Meeting 84 (2 Feb. 1968). The name was considered in the review of a National Geographic Society map of the South Atlantic. The name appears on GEBCO 5.12.

7.4a Ita Mai Tai Guyot in the ACUF Gazetteer (*Lat* $12^{\circ}30$ "N, *Long* $157^{\circ}10$ "E) is not the same feature as the proposed Gaori Guyot (*Lat* $12^{\circ}50$ 'N, *Long* $156^{\circ}50$ 'E). Ita Mai Tai Guyot was approved by ACUF at Meeting 214 (25 Sept. 1984). The name was proposed by Dr. Mammerickx of Scripps. The original documentation of the proposal was not found. Older bathymetric sources indicate (probably mistakenly) a more distinct, separate feature at the coordinates listed for Ita Mai Tai Guyot than that shown in the more recent data. The Gaori Guyot contours seem to indicate a broader, single feature spreading over the general area formerly thought to consist of several discrete features.

8.2 Palmer took an action to check latitude position of **Fred Spiess Seamount:** should be 32° 16' N.

NOTE: SCUFN 22 Report shows the name as **Spiess Seamount**. It should be **Fred Spiess Seamount**.
