UK Delivery of Hydrographic Services



ENCs

3.5 Within the EAtHC region, UK has released a total of 89 ENC cells, 19 of them since the last EAtHC meeting. Coverage currently comprises 24 Harbour, 26 Approach, 34 Coastal, 1 General and 4 Overview cells. See diagrams in 3.a.12 and 3.a.13. A detailed listing has been provided to the EAtHC Chair and to the INT Region G Chart Coordinator.

3.6 A further 17 cells are currently in progress. GB200311 is due to replace GB200604 in October 2010.

Digital Publications

4.3 UK continues to develop digital equivalents to its existing paper publications; these have the two advantages to the mariner of providing additional functionality and minimising the task of updating.

4.4 The Admiralty digital catalogue may be downloaded free from the UKHO website; it includes details of all paper and digital charts and publications and is updated weekly. It is a useful tool to check on the ENC coverage within the region and to show the latest edition dates of both charts and publications.

5 MSI

5.1 The UK's principal responsibility within the EAtHC region is for those areas where UK continues as primary charting authority, including Gambia, Ghana, Nigeria and Sierra Leone.

5.2 UK maintains close liaison with France, the coordinator for NAVAREA II, as well as, with the coordinators of adjacent NAVAREAs. Any information, received at UKHO, which requires urgent promulgation, is passed to the appropriate co-ordinator. It is understood that plans for 2 new NAVTEX stations in Nigeria (in Lagos and Bonny) are at an advanced stage, and the Ivory Coast and Ghana have provisional plans to install new NAVTEX stations. Notwithstanding the historical lack of GMDSS facilities in the region, it may not be necessary to establish two new NAVTEX stations in such close proximity to each other. The NAVAREA II Co-ordinator has undertaken the responsibility to coordinate the developments in this area, to ensure that a strategic approach is adhered to, taking into account the character and volume of information likely to be transmitted in relation to the maritime traffic patterns in the region. In November 2009, Senegal announced full operational status of a new NAVTEX station at Dakar on 518 kHz and 490 kHz using B1 characters [C] and [M] respectively.

6 C-55 (previously known as S-55) LATEST UPDATE

6.1 As described in the UK Generic National Report, UK is committed to providing regular updates to the C-55 entries for UK Home Waters and its Overseas Territories. See C-55 on IHO website for the latest update.

6.2 UK also provides assistance to update C-55 entries to countries such as Gambia, Ghana, Nigeria and Sierra Leone, where UKHO retains the primary charting responsibility, recognizing that local input remains critical to the maintenance of C-55 as an up-to-date and authoritative reference document.

7 CAPACITY BUILDING

Offer of and/or demand for Capacity Building

7.1 UK fully supports the IHO CBC strategy and particularly its emphasis on getting Phase 1 and appropriate Phase 2 capacity in place to enable coastal states to meet their obligations under SOLAS Chapter V Regulations 4 and 9. UK will continue to contribute resources to both CBC initiatives and to bilateral assistance.

7.2 Since the last EAtHC meeting, UK has participated in numerous technical workshops, in a number of RHC areas.

7.3 UKHO has created a post dedicated to capacity building. Its key aims are to ensure that capacity building is properly considered in UKHO activity and that UKHO's capacity building activities are fully co-ordinated. It will act as the initial point of contact for UKHO involvement in capacity building activities, including UK involvement in regional hydrographic commission initiatives and IHO Capacity Building Committee activities. It will have a particular responsibility for UK Overseas Territories and liaison with UK's Foreign and Commonwealth Office and with overseas High Commissions to generate phased development of capability and new survey activity. Training received, needed, offered

Training provided by UKHO

7.4 The UK Generic National Report, posted on the IHO website, includes a general description of training provided by UKHO. Further details of the training opportunities offered by UKHO are provided on the UKHO website.

7.5 The fourth Maritime Safety Information Training Course was conducted on behalf of the IHO Capacity Building Committee and the IHO World-Wide Navigational Warning Service (WWNWS) Sub-Committee between 15-17 September 2009, at the Regional Maritime University of Accra, Ghana. This course was requested by the EAtHC in order to benefit countries in its area of influence.

UKHO provided the lead instructor who was ably assisted by two instructors from SHOM and one from NGA. This was the first MSI Training Course conducted in dual languages (English/French). NAVAREA II Coordinator had prepared hard copy versions of all the PowerPoint presentations in French, and although all the lectures and practical exercises were conducted in English, a synopsis and question/answer session in French was conducted at the end of each session.

17 participants attended the course from 10 countries; Ghana, Bénin, Gambia, Guinea Bissau, Guinée, Côte D'Ivoire, Mauritania, Nigeria, Sénégal and Togo.
