GEBCO CENTENARY CELEBRATIONS

Dear Sir or Madam,

We would like to inform you that the Centenary commemoration of the General Bathymetric Chart of the Oceans (GEBCO), which was initiated by Prince Albert 1er of Monaco, will take place in Monaco on 14-16 April 2003. The whole event will include a Conference, a commercial exhibition, a technical ocean mapping exhibition, social events, ships visits, and the unveiling of a commemorative plaque. This event is jointly organized by the International Hydrographic Organization (IHO) and the Intergovernmental Oceanographic Commission (IOC), with contribution from the Government of Monaco, through a Centenary Organizing Committee chaired by Sir Anthony Laughton, Chairman of GEBCO. It is planned that the GEBCO Centenary Conference will be opened by Prince Rainier or Prince Albert.

The Conference Programme, which will embrace the history of GEBCO and its development to the present day, is being prepared by a Conference Committee chaired by Dr Michael Loughridge, Director of the IHO Data Centre for Digital Bathymetry. The Programme will include keynote speakers followed with technical and scientific presentations. It is anticipated that the Conference will be attended by more than 300 participants and the Government of Monaco has kindly offered to make available a suitable venue for the Conference. Simultaneous translation in English and French will be provided.

The Conference Organizing Committee has set up a fee of US\$ 100,00 for each attendee. However, the IHB is working on to possibly provide one free admittance for each IHO Member State.

We would appreciate if you could inform the IHB on whether you plan to attend this event, as well as on the potential visit of hydrographic/oceanographic ships at this occasion, by the end of October 2002. Block bookings have been made in several hotels in Monaco (see Annex B) and early reservations can already be secured by sending the hotel booking form in Annex C directly to the hotel selected, with a copy to the IHB (info@ihb.mc, Attn: Ms M. Mollet), after having completed the upper part of the form.
