## WORKING GROUP ON S-44 STANDARDS FOR HYDROGRAPHIC SURVEYS

Dear Hydrographer,

The current 4<sup>th</sup> Edition of S-44 was published in April 1998, since when the Working Group has been dormant. Former members of the Working Group are shown at Annex A. The IHB has received a letter from Australia, attached at Annex B, requesting that the S-44 WG be re-convened "to undertake a full review of the current edition and the subsequent publication of a revised edition that takes into account the latest technology and contemporary requirements for hydrographic data".

The IHB forwarded the Australian Document to the 16<sup>th</sup> CHRIS meeting, which was held in Ottawa, Canada in May 2004 where there was broad support for the revision of S-44 and, therefore, the re-convening of the S-44 WG.

The IHB, therefore, intends to re-convene the S-44 WG unless Member States have strong objections. Member States are requested to provide comments and any nominations for the WG that they might wish to make to the IHB **by 17 September 2004**.

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#### Review of S44

Dear Sir,

In Australia's view several deficiencies or omissions in S-44 are now apparent that merit an urgent review of the document.

The current edition of S-44 IHO Standards for Hydrographic Surveys was published in 1998. Since then, a number of technical developments have matured, and in particular MBES has entered widespread use, yet is not adequately catered for in the current edition.

Examples of areas that require review and updating include:

greater clarity is required in designating the nature and size of undersea features ("targets");

a more realistic review of the capabilities of contemporary technology; inclusion of standards for metadata and attributes for use in data quality attribution, both for nautical charting (e.g. S-57 Zones of Confidence) and more detailed GIS analysis;

facilitate review by a wider range of stakeholders, i.e. including academia, and industry (manufacturers and surveyors);

Chapter 2 of the 3rd edition of S-44 "Classification Criteria for Deep Ocean Soundings" was retained in the current edition for historical reasons. It was reproduced without amendment but may now be considered as requiring review in light of technological developments and quality attribution.

At the time the current, 4<sup>th</sup> edition was published it was expected that S-44 would be subject to review leading to a new edition after a period of five years. It is therefore requested that consideration be given to re-convening the S-44 Working Group to

undertake a full review of the current edition and the subsequent publication of a revised edition that takes into account the latest technology and contemporary requirements for hydrographic data.
