FACTS ABOUT CHARTS AND CARRIAGE REQUIREMENTS

Dear Hydrographer,

At the IMO Sub-Committee on Safety of Navigation meeting this year (NAV 51) the President, along with the heads of the Norwegian and UK Hydrographic Offices gave a presentation to publicise a document 'Facts about Charts and Carriage Requirements'. The document was created by two Regional ENC Coordinating Centres (RENCs) Primar-Stavanger and IC-ENC in an attempt to clarify the confusion over the regulations surrounding the use of ECDIS to meet SOLAS chart carriage requirements. Feedback provided by mariners to the RENCs had previously indicated that there was significant confusion on issues such as the use of Raster Navigational Charts (RNCs), acceptable back-up solutions and training requirements and that these uncertainties were a barrier to the uptake of ECDIS. It is hoped that the document, which can be downloaded free of charge from either www.primar-stavanger.org or www.ic-enc.org websites, goes some way to clarify these issues.

The document has been endorsed by eight European regulatory authorities and it contains, as an annex, a compendium of national requirements from 13 countries. The authors are in the process of updating the document and are seeking, through IHO and IMO, your assistance to extend it to include your national requirements within the compendium. They would also be grateful for any other feedback that you may have on the document and an indication as to whether you would like to endorse it. A questionnaire is attached to assist in gathering information in a consistent manner and the Directing Committee would be grateful if you could complete this and return it to the contact address given.

The authors will seek confirmation from each national authority that the information that they have supplied has been accurately transferred to the document prior to publication. The Directing Committee is sure that you will agree that it is important that we provide the mariner with full, up to date, and consistent information and we thank you in advance for your assistance.

IHO MS Questionnaire on the use of ENCs and Chart Carriage Requirements

Reference: Circular Letter 88/2005 dated 31 August 2005

Background:

In July 2002 SOLAS Chapter 5 was amended and for the first time included provision for the use of an electronic means of navigation to meet SOLAS chart carriage requirements. Such provision is included specifically in SOLAS V Regulation 19.2.1.4. Details of ECDIS (Electronic Chart Display and Information System) and its use are contained in the IMO ECDIS Performance Standard A817(19); this specifies equipment capability and addresses issues such as back-up and use of charts.

SOLAS Chapter 5 Regulation 19.2.1.4 states:

nautical charts and nautical publications to plan and display the ship's route for the intended voyage and to plot and monitor positions throughout the voyage; an Electronic Chart Display and Information System (ECDIS) may be accepted as meeting the chart carriage requirements of this subparagraph; 2.1.5 back-up arrangements to meet the functional requirements of subparagraph 2.1.4, if this function is partly or fully fulfilled by electronic means;*

* An appropriate folio of paper nautical charts may be used as a back-up arrangement for ECDIS. Other back-up arrangements for ECDIS are acceptable (see appendix 6 to resolution A.817(19), as amended).

IMO ECDIS Performance Standard A817(19) states:

Electronic Chart Display and Information System (ECDIS) means a navigation information system which, with adequate back up arrangements, can be accepted as complying with the upto-date chart required by regulation V/19 & V/27 of the 1974 SOLAS Convention.

Whilst the intention of these regulations is clearly to allow the use of ECDIS to meet chart carriage requirements there is still confusion on some issues. For example it is unclear if the word 'may' in Regulation 19.2.1.4 means the use of ECDIS to meet chart carriage requirements is at the choice of the mariner or at the discretion of the Flag State. In addition, there is still uncertainty within the different national maritime safety authorities on matters related to the use of RNCs, ECDIS backup and ECDIS training; as a result the mariner does not have a clear picture of the requirements should he wish to use ECDIS for primary navigation.

To help clarify the picture two Regional ENC Coordinating Centres (Primar Stavanger and IC-ENC) have joined forces, compiled, with the assistance of BIMCO, the 'Facts about Charts and Carriage Requirements' document. The document may be downloaded from the RENC websites; www.primar-stavanger.org or www.ic-enc.org.

Where ENCs are available they must be used in ECDIS to meet chart carriage requirements. For areas where ENC coverage is not yet available the IMO ECDIS Performance Standard (as amended in 1998) allows the use of official Raster Nautical Charts (RNCs) in ECDIS to meet chart carriage requirements for navigation; however when operating in this manner 'ECDIS' equipment should be used together with an appropriate portfolio of up-to-date paper charts'
