**TENTH (10TH) HYDROGRAPHIC COURSE AT THE NATIONAL
HYDROGRAPHIC SCHOOL, GOA, INDIA
(18 JUNE 2007 - 19 JANUARY 2008)**

(Recognised at Level B of the International Standards of Competence for Hydrographic Surveyors)

Reference: CL 26/2006 dated 01 March 2006.

Dear Hydrographer,

1. The ninth Hydrographic Course for personnel from Indian Ocean Littoral States, as announced in the above Circular Letter, commenced at the National Hydrographic School, Goa in June 2006 and completed towards the end of January 2007 after an 8-week afloat attachment to Indian Naval Hydrographic Ships for practical training.
2. The Chief Hydrographer to the Government of India has now informed the IHB, on behalf of the Indian Government, that there will be a Tenth Hydrographic Course at the National Hydrographic School, Goa in 2007 – 2008.
3. The Course will commence on Monday 18 June 2007 and the theoretical part (including field practicals) will end on 24 November 2007. This phase will be followed by an eight-week practical training phase onboard an Indian Naval Hydrographic Ship. The second phase will start on 26 November 2007 and end on 19 January 2008.
4. Up to 6 male trainees from developing countries from the Indian Ocean littoral region will be considered for financing by the Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India. However, allocation of slots under the financial support scheme will be solely at the discretion of the Government of India.
5. The support provided by the Government of India will cover accommodation, medical expenses, internal travel and a reasonable living allowance to cater for food and small out-of-pocket expenses. Free air travel to and from the respective countries might also be considered in a few cases in accordance with Government of India policy.
6. This course would also be available to other countries, in addition, under the Self Financing Scheme. The training charges under the Self Financing Scheme will be approximately Indian Rupees 11,230/- per week for the theoretical phase and Indian Rupees 4,500/- per week for the afloat attachment. In addition, charges towards messing, laundry and other personal incidentals will be payable by the candidates as per actuals.

8. It is essential that candidates are employed by the hydrographic office or the port authority of their country. The nomination must be originated by the employer and should include a statement specifying that the candidate will be employed in the government or port authority service once he has successfully completed the course.

9. The educational requirement is education to college level including mathematics and physics. The candidates should also be in the possession of a bridge watch-keeping certificate on a naval/ocean going vessel or equivalent. A good knowledge of English is also necessary, as it will be the language of instruction used throughout the course.

10. The course programme will cover the syllabi specified for Category 'B' level in the Ninth Edition of the Standards of Competence for Hydrographic Surveyors.

Students are required to arrive in Goa on 17 June 2007.

Accommodation: Twin-bedded room (two students per room) for the first phase. The accommodation onboard the Indian Naval Survey Ship for the second phase will be as per availability.
