## ENTRY INTO FORCE OF REVISED EDITION OF S-63 – IHO Data Protection Scheme

References: 1) IHB Circular Letter 65/2003 dated 6 November 2003

2) 19th CHRIS Meeting -Action 19/15

Dear Hydrographer,

- 1. At its 19th meeting in Rotterdam in November 2007 the Committee on Hydrographic Requirements for Information Systems (CHRIS), as the relevant IHO technical committee, endorsed for publication a revised edition of S-63 *IHO Data Protection Scheme*. This edition will be S-63 edition 1.1 and it will supersede edition 1.0 which was announced by the IHB Circular Letter in reference 1.
- 2. The principal changes in S-63 e1.1 are:
  - Changes in the structure of the document to make it easier to use.
  - The inclusion of the texts from published guidance notes.
  - Introduction of some minor changes to assist operability and overcome certain problems identified with implementation.
- 3. Following an amendment to the IMO Performance Standard, ECDIS installed after 1st January 2009 will be required to have an S-63 capability. The ECDIS test standard (IEC 61174) is being amended to include appropriate tests. The introduction of S-63 e1.1 will not adversely affect existing ECDIS users or systems.
- 4. The <u>draft edition 1.1 of S-63</u> is available on the IHO website (<u>www.iho.int</u> > Committees > CHRIS > CHRIS19 Documents > Doc. CHRIS19-06.3B). A revised test data set will be included as part of the new edition for use with the revised edition of IEC 61174 *Test Specification for ECDIS* which is expected to come into force in 2008.
- 5. As a consequence of the endorsement of S-63 e1.1 by CHRIS, the IHB proposes publishing the revised edition as soon as possible. Member States are therefore invited to comment on this proposal by **15 February 2008**. If no objections are received, the IHB will publish S-63 e1.1 on <u>1 March 2008</u>.
