CATEGORY B HYDROGRAPHIC COURSE AT THE BANGLADESH NAVY HYDROGRAPHIC SCHOOL (03 April - 01 September 2011)

Dear Hydrographer,

- The Bangladesh Navy (BN) is going to conduct a Cat. B Hydrographic Course from 3 April to 1 September 2011 at the Bangladesh Navy Hydrographic School in Chittagong. This programme was recognized as a Category B level hydrographic course in 2005. The syllabus of this Cat. B course provides a practical comprehension of hydrographic surveying for individuals with the skill to carry out various hydrographic surveying tasks.
- To date, candidates from the Bangladesh Navy and other national maritime organizations have taken part in various courses at the BN Hydrographic School. However, the BN feels that regional and sub-regional countries should also benefit from the courses conducted at the BN Hydrographic School. The forthcoming Cat. B course is an excellent opportunity in this regard.
- 3 A description of the Course, along with application details, is given here below:

Bangladesh Navy (BN) Cat. B Hydrographic Course Programme and other relevant matters

- i. The BN Hydrographic School's Cat. B course is designed in accordance with the guidelines contained in the M-5 IHO publication which includes theoretical and practical classes, project survey etc. The language of instruction is English. Candidates should have the following qualifications:
 - a. Nautical branch naval officer having sufficient knowledge in mathematics and physics.
 - b. Civilian officers should have a Bachelor's Degree in Mathematics or Physics.
 - c. Good command of English.

iv. The BN conducts various courses in its training establishments at Chittagong and Khulna. Many officers from regional and extra regional countries such as Sri Lanka, India, Pakistan, Maldives, Qatar, KSA, Lebanon, Nigeria etc. take part in these courses. In the training establishments there is separate accommodation and messing for officers. In addition to that medical, laundry, batman, canteen, sports, gym and swimming facilities etc. are also available for the student officers. Generally, all internal visits are arranged by the BN at free cost. However, the other costs such as tuition fees, international travel, allowances, messing and accommodation charges etc. depend upon the agreement between the governments which is flexible in nature. Usually the relevant Embassy in Dhaka takes the initiative to settle the terms and conditions in coordination with the Directorate of Naval Training at Naval Headquarters.
