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## IMPLEMENTATION OF THE STRATEGIC PLAN


Dear Hydrographer,

1 During the XVIIIth International Hydrographic Conference (IHC) the Directing Committee, as part of its report of Work Programme no. 1 – Corporate Affairs – described the actions undertaken by the Bureau in order to progress the implementation of the Strategic Plan in accordance with the observations and decisions taken during the 4<sup>th</sup> EIHC in 2009 and the offer for support provided by the Norwegian Hydrographic Service (NHS). After some initial delays because the expert originally provided by the NHS was redeployed, an effective and productive cooperation is now in place to address three issues; the implementation of the Strategic Plan (ISP) process, the Risk Management (RM) and the Performance Indicators (PIs). Based on comments received from the Inter-Regional Coordination Committee (IRCC), it was decided not to progress any changes to the SP and RM, before further experience was gained. Meanwhile, the two IHO Committees (HSSC and IRCC) were invited to reexamine the Working PIs (WPIs) and consider both reducing and improving them.

2 The Directing Committee in cooperation with the expert provided by the NHC, has taken the existing Strategic PIs (SPIs) and will use them to monitor the achievement of the objectives of the Organization, as they have been identified in Table 1 of Annex C of the 2009 Strategic Plan. Based on the experience that will be gained over the next few years and any feedback from Member States, the Directing Committee will consider the need to improve or amend these SPIs. It is also anticipated that a revised Table 1 and 2 of Annex C of the WPIs and the SPIs, will be prepared by the Directing Committee, after the two Committees have completed their review and finalized their proposals regarding the WPIs.

3 For the periodic review of the achievements of the objectives of the Organization based on the SPIs, the Directing Committee will use a standardized reporting table (Balanced Scorecard), through which it will report periodically to Member States. This table was presented to the XVIIIth IHC with the report on the ISP and is attached for your further consideration. The table will be finalized based on any comments received from Member States by Tuesday 31<sup>st</sup> July.
