- Baselines, Territorial Sea, Contiguous Zone
 Continental Shelf, Exclusive Economic Zone
 Islands
- Vague or incomplete provisions have left room for different applications in state practice
- Question of discretion and a lack of clearly defined limits

Factors behind creeping jurisdiction

- 1. Protection of economic interests
 - Russia in the Peanut Hole
 - United States and Russia in the Donut Hole
- 2. To overcome geographic and/or natural disadvantages
 - 1952 Santiago Declaration
- 3. Political relations
 - Canada and the EC
- 4. To protect security interests
 - Military vessels and warships
