

Dr. Irimi Papanicolopulu is presently Marie Curie Fellow at the University of Oxford, Faculty of Law, where is carrying out a research project on integrating the human element into law of the sea. She is also Senior Researcher in international law at the University of Milano-Bicocca, where she teaches international law of natural resources and international law of armed conflicts. She holds a Degree in Law from the same university and a Doctorate in International Law from the University of Milano and has attended the Rhodes Academy on Oceans Law and Policy in 1999 and 2001. She has published a volume on maritime delimitation and several articles covering a wide range of issues of international law and law of the sea, including entitlement and rights in maritime zones, the delimitation of maritime boundaries and State responsibility in contested maritime areas. She has acted as legal expert for the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs on law of the sea matters, at the EU and international level.
