Weather

They say you can't beat Wellington on a good day, and we reckon that's true. Unfortunately you need to be prepared for the worst in winter.

Winter: June – August

Average daily max: 11.5°C / 53°F min: 6.5°C/44°F

Wellington's winter tends to be wet rather than frosty, with around a 55% daily chance of rain through the winter months. So a Wellington winter wardrobe is more likely to waterproof than woollen. Only 5% of that rain is classified as heavy, however. The city is also well-designed for winter with plenty of indoor activities and warm dining options.

Cold, windy with a good chance of rain – our warm welcome will more than make up for the weather!
