

Introduction / Background

The fairway to Antwerp runs through the Westerschelde river along a deep and narrow route. For reasons of safety the authorities introduced a number of secondary fairways, called "Fietspad" (cycling path)

Analysis / Discussion

The secondary fairways are meant for small craft, in order to reduce traffic in the main fairway. These fairways are meant as alternative route for small craft and inland shipping. The route runs parallel to the red or green side of the main fairway and marked by yellow buoys on the outside. Soon after the introduction of these secondary fairways they had to be charted, but had already a name (Fietspad) and a certain status. After some discussion we decided to visualize them on the chart as follows:
