Dear Hydrographer,

The final minutes of the 16<sup>th</sup> CHRIS Meeting held in Ottawa, Canada on 28-31 May 2004, as well as all documents referred to at this meeting, are available on the CHRIS page of the IHO website<sup>1</sup> (www.iho.shom.fr > Committees > CHRIS). The Meeting was chaired by Mr. Ole BERG (Denmark). A list of actions arising from this meeting, with their current status, is provided in **Annex A** Member States' attention is drawn to the following main points:

<u>Improving ENC Consistency</u> (see Section 5.1 of the Minutes)

The Meeting approved a set of 13 recommendations for ENC encoding, intended for improving consistency between ENCs produced by various HOs and which had been prepared by TSMAD as "advice for good encoding practice", based on papers provided by IC-ENC. These recommendations relate in particular to the setting of compilation scales, the use of the SCAMIN attribute and the assignment of navigational purposes. They were circulated to MS in CL 47/2004. They have also been posted as separate ENC Encoding Bulletins on the IHO website (see <u>www.iho.shom.fr</u> > ENC > ENC Bulletin).

## Revision of IHO Publication S-52 (see Section 5.2 of the Minutes)

With a view to focusing S52 on the display aspects of hydrographic information contained in an ENC data set and to referring to the other relevant references for information outside this focus, the Meeting recommended that S-52 be revised by:

- Removing all information already covered by the IMO Performance Standards for ECDIS (IMO PS) or other IHO standards, i.e. S-57, *Transfer Standard*, or that could be transferred to other IHO standards, i.e. S-32, *Hydrographic Dictionary*;
- Removing all information that does not pertain to the display aspects of hydrographic information presented in an ECDIS after this information is hosted by the standard defining operational requirements for ECDIS as navigation devices, i.e. the IMO PS.

Amendments to S-52 and the IMO PS were prepared accordingly and, as the precise changes to S-52 and their effective date are dependent on the approval by IMO of the changes to the IMO PS, CL 69/2004 sought MS' approval for a submission to IMO recommending such changes. There was overwhelming support by MS for such a submission, as reported in CL 05/2005. As a result, a proposal for amending the IMO PS was submitted to IMO for consideration by MSC 80 in May 2005. In order to conform to the IMO rule stating that any submission should have the support of at least one IMO MS, Greece was approached and has kindly accepted to join the IHO in this submission. The IHO-Greece proposal to MSC 80 can be consulted on the IHO website (www.iho.shom.fr > Committees > CHRIS > revision of S-52). MS approval of a new edition of S52 will be sought after IMO has acted on the IHO-Greece submission and their actions reflected in the revised IMO PS.

## S-57 Edition 4.0 Information Paper (see Section 6.1 of the Minutes)

In order to inform all potential users of S-57 of the direction that Edition 4.0 will take and the implications for producers and users of ENCs, the Meeting tasked the TSMAD Chairman (Mr Michael Brown, USA) with the preparation of an information paper. An S57 Edition 4.0 Information Paper was consequently produced and made available on the IHO website (www.iho.shom.fr > ENC > Introduction > IHO Special Publication S-57), as reported in CL 83/2004. This paper indicates that, while it is intended to release Edition 4.0 towards the end of 2006 and a new ENC Product Specification approximately one year later, Edition 3.1 and its associated ENC Product Specification will continue to be valid for many years to come, even after Edition 4.0 has been released. Therefore, HOs should continue to produce Edition 3.1 ENC data in order to continue to improve worldwide ENC coverage.

The 2005 ECDIS Stakeholder Forum, to be held in conjunction with the next CHRIS meeting (see last paragraph), should provide an ideal opportunity to discuss these issues and enhance the S-57 Edition 4.0 Information Paper.

## Charting of Port Security Limits (see Section 13.2 of the Minutes)

The Meeting considered a request for guidance by Australia on the charting of port security zones and limits (see Doc. CHRIS16-INF4 on <u>www.iho.shom.fr</u> > Committees > CHRIS > List of CHRIS/16 Documents). There is currently no international guidance on the matter; Australia requested that the IHO establish whether the boundaries need to be shown on charts, and if so, when and how they should be inserted and what symbology is to be used. They felt this could have a significant impact on the charting programmes and resources of HOs, particularly for coastal states possessing a large number of ports.

It was agreed that the IHB would seek responses from MS regarding the principle of where administrative borders, such as port security limits, should be included: chart products or nautical publications or both? MS are therefore kindly requested to complete the form at Annex B, and return it to the IHB **by 30 April 2005**. CHRIS will then consider the results of this survey and provide guidance on the matter as appropriate.

#### Chair and Vice Chair of CHRIS

In October 2004, the HB was informed that Mr Ole BERG (Denmark) would be leaving the Danish Hydrographic Office (KMS) on 1<sup>st</sup> February 2005 and would have to relinquish the CHRIS Chairmanship by <sup>pt</sup> January 2005. The then CHRIS Vice Chair, Captain Robert WARD (Australia), was approached and he indicated that he would be willing and allowed to act as CHRIS Chair. This proposal received unanimous support from the CHRIS Members through CHRIS Letter 3/2004. As a result, Captain WARD took over as CHRIS Chairman on 1<sup>st</sup> January 2005.

CHRIS Members were subsequently requested to select a new CHRIS Vice Chair among three candidates (CHRIS Letter 4/2004 refers). A majority of the votes<sup>2</sup> were for Mr Parry OEI (Singapore) who is therefore elected as Vice Chair of CHRIS.

The IHB Directing Committee is very grateful to Mr BERG for his outstanding contribution during his tenure as CHRIS Chair, congratulates the new Chair and Vice Chair of CHRIS, and thanks their respective HOs for making them available for these positions. The IHB is convinced that CHRIS will remain in good hands with Captain WARD in command.

The 17<sup>th</sup> CHRIS Meeting will take place from 5 to 9 September 2005 at the BSH (German HO), Rostock, Germany. The 2005 ECDIS Stakeholder Forum (formerly, 'Industry Days') has been planned on 5 pm and 6 September, in conjunction with CHRIS/17.
