


Venue



Transportation

Taxis are the recommended form of transportation in Canberra. There is a clearly marked taxi rank in front of Canberra airport. All taxis are required to use meters, and cash or credit cards can be used for payment (receipts are available on request). Large taxi vans are available for larger groups. The approximate fare from the airport to Hotel Kurrajong will be AUD\$20.

Weather

Canberra has four seasons, similar to Europe or North America, however the seasons are reversed, with spring in September-November, summer December-February, autumn March-May, and winter June-August. The average temperature for Canberra in November is a high of 23°C and a low of 10°C. Rain is possible, but infrequent.

Official Language

The official language of Australia is English. Transportation through Australia's main airport hubs (Sydney, Melbourne) will have assistance in other languages, but Canberra airport is principally English only. If you believe you will require assistance, please contact the hosts.

Tourist Information

Although Canberra is the national capital of Australia, it is relatively small in size, supporting a population of approximately 400,000 and being the eighth largest city in Australia. The site of Canberra was selected for the location of the nation's capital in 1908 as a compromise between rivals Sydney and Melbourne, Australia's two largest cities. It is unusual among Australian cities, being an entirely planned city outside of any state, similar to Washington, D.C. in the United States, or Brasília in Brazil. The city's design was influenced by the garden city movement and incorporates significant areas of natural vegetation.

Electrical Power

Mains voltage in Australia is 230V 50Hz. Travellers from most nations in Asia, Africa and Europe should have appliances that work on the same mains voltage as Australia - therefore you will not need a voltage converter. Notable exceptions to this are Japan, USA and Canada which uses 100/120V 50/60Hz. If your country does not use appliances within the 230V 50Hz mains voltage range, you will need to purchase a voltage converter. You will also need a power adapter.

The plugs in Australia have 2 flat metal pins shaped live a "V" and some may contain a third flat pin in the centre.

Currency

The Australian dollar (sign: \$; code: AUD) is the currency of the Commonwealth of Australia, including its external territories Christmas Island, Cocos (Keeling) Islands, and Norfolk Island, as well as the independent Pacific Island states of Kiribati, Nauru, Papua New Guinea, Tonga, Tuvalu, and Vanuatu. Within Australia, it is almost always abbreviated with the dollar sign (\$), with A\$ or AU\$ sometimes used to distinguish it from other dollar-denominated currencies. It is subdivided into 100 cents.
