Introduction / Background

As reported by TSMAD S-101 phase 1 was completed in December 2010 and phase 2 should be completed at the end of the year. With the approaching release of S-101 standard, as thoughts move towards migration plans, it seems important to consider the impact on relevant stakeholders.

Analysis/Discussion

Building and maintenance of S-101 must integrate inputs from S-57 feedback and new technical possibilities, but should also pay attention to user requirements and must evaluate the impact on currents tools and organisations.

Before official endorsement of S-101 standard, we must be able to evaluate the potential cost impacts of S-101 on the maritime industry, Member States or other involved parties. We must also propose a realistic timeline for migration.

Recommendations

As foreseen in 2/2007 resolution (ref. 1/) "HSSC should consider the impact on relevant stakeholders when assessing a proposal and planning any subsequent work. This assessment should systematically include a risk and feasibility analysis, and an estimate of the resources needed for the implementation of a new or revised standard or its development, including within Member States Hydrographic Services."

The development of S-101 standard should not be treated as a special case.

Justification and Impacts

This impact study should be done within the scope of the current TSMAD Work Plan with high priority. This action involves all TSMAD MS dealing with S-101, with great benefits to stakeholders.

Action Required of HSSC

The HSSC is invited to:

- a. endorse the application of the resolution 2/2007 for S-101 standard
- b. agree to modify the TSMAD Work Plan as a consequence
- c. note this paper for further discussions within TSMAD WG and stakeholders community
