Reviewing action items from our last SCUFN meeting, I submit the following information:

- 1) Name origin for _Chorreras Canyon_: The canyon was named after Arroyo Chorreras, a stream along the coast of Mexico in Tamaulipas adjacent to the feature.
- 2) __Tehuantepec Ridge vs.__Tehuantepec Fracture Zone_: I have looked at Smith and Sandwell's measured and estimated seafloor topography and the tectonic literature for evidence that this feature is a fracture zone. The crust to the south of the feature (Guatemala Basin) is older than the crust to the north. Magnetic and gravity anomalies indicate the feature is a fracture zone. The Tehuantepec Ridge was named by Bob Fisher in 1957 before the theory of Plate Tectonics came on the scene. I propose that we discuss changing the name of the feature from ridge to fracture zone at our meeting. See attached journal article abstracts for more details.
