## 1. Opening

## 2. Approval of Minutes of ACUF 325

The Committee approved the corrected minutes of the 325<sup>th</sup> meeting.

One new name in the Scotia Sea was proposed by the NOAA Southwest Fisheries Science Center and had been deferred at ACUF 325. Subsequently Mr. Theberge contacted the proposing organization and verified that it endorsed the below proposal. The name was considered ACCEPTED and was approved at the January 2008 BGN Meeting (240).

## 3.3. ACUF Secretary:

Mr. PALMER reported the following:

- The five new names proposed by Dr. SMITH, University of Hawaii, and recommended for approval at ACUF 325 were deferred by the BGN. The Deputy Member from the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service requested that some time be given so that representatives in Hawaii could be contacted about the proposals and the appropriate contacts made within the local community. The specific concern was that some of the features fall within the Papahānaumokuākea Marine National Monument. Subsequently, a shapefile representing the limits of the monument was obtained by Mr. PALMER. Mr. THEBERGE is checking with the NOAA representative and Dr. SHOR offered to find out more from Hawaiian officials.
- Circulated two articles of possible interest: A proposal for re-scheming of the regional International Bathymetric Charts (from *Hydro International*); and a discussion of the Alaska Region research vessel (from *Sea Technology*).

### 3.4. ACUF Members

- 3.4.1. Mr. Theberge reported the following:
  - He asked Mr. Craig McLean, NOAA, about possible ACUF membership. Mr. McLean started NOAA's Ocean Exploration Program and currently is the Deputy Administrator of NOAA's research arm.
