Remarks: He was known as the "God of navigation" within the Navy. He is most renowned for creating a table for astronomical observation calculation, known as the "Yonemura Table". In 1929, he was despatched to the 1st Extraordinary International Hydrographic Conference as the representative of Japan.






Fig. 1. Bathymetric map of the Yonemura Seamount. The bathymetric contour interval is 100 m.




Fig. 2. Bathymetric map of the Yonemura Seamount, showing track lines. The bathymetric contour interval is 100 m.
