1. General information.

The meeting will take place in the main conference room at the International Hydrographic Bureau (IHB), which is adjacent to Quai Antoine 1er – close to the port. (Please see attached map). Additional meeting rooms will be available for break out meetings if required.

Unless otherwise advised, the meeting will commence at 09:00 on Monday the 7th of May. All meeting documents will be made available on the IHO web site (www.iho.int) from the TSMAD 24 and DIPWG 4 document pages.

WIFI Internet access will be available in the Conference room and from all breakout rooms.

Please note that Monaco uses standard CEE 7/5 (French) power socket and members are kindly requested to bring their own power socket adapters.
