Dear Hydrographer,

- 1. References A and B indicate that the Directing Committee shall invite the following as Observers to International Hydrographic Conferences (IHC):
 - a. Governments that are not Parties to the Convention: one or two Observers each, if proposed by a Member or by the Bureau, and subject to approval by two-thirds of the Members;
 - b. Member Governments with rights suspended under Article XV of the Convention, as implemented in accordance with Articles 16 and 17 of the Financial Regulations: one or two Observers each, one of whom should preferably be the head of the national Hydrographic Office;
 - c. Intergovernmental organizations with which an agreement or special arrangement has been made: one or exceptionally two Observers each; and
 - d. Non-governmental international organizations with which the Organization has established appropriate relationships in accordance with the Guidelines for the Accreditation of Non-Governmental International Organizations: one or exceptionally two Observers each.
- 2. In accordance with the new General Regulations of the IHO (not yet in force), similar provisions would apply in the case of the first session of the IHO Assembly (A-1).
- 3. The Directing Committee has prepared a list (see Annex A) according to each of the categories described above, indicating the governments, intergovernmental organizations and non-governmental international organizations that are eligible to be invited to send Observers to the XIXth International Hydrographic Conference/1st session of the IHO Assembly (IHC-19/A-1).
- 4. In addition, the Directing Committee provides a list in Annex B that shows those other organizations, including a few national organizations, that Member States have previously agreed should be invited to send Observers to IHC. The list indicates those organizations that attended IHC-17, EIHC-4, IHC-18 or EIHC-5.

5. In accordance with the schedule at Annex B of Reference C, the Directing Committee is now asking Member States to review the lists in the Annexes and to provide comments, if they wish. The Directing Committee particularly requests a careful review of the list in Annex B that shows those non-accredited organizations that were invited to EIHC-5 (see References D and E). The Directing Committee proposes inviting to the IHC-19/A-1 only those organizations that are specifically nominated by Member States.

Action Requested of Member States

- 6. Member States are asked to mark up a copy of Annex B, indicating those organizations that they consider should be invited to IHC-19/A-1. Member States are also invited to forward any other comments on the lists in general, and to propose any additional organizations that they consider should be invited, together with a short justification. The Directing Committee will then draw up proposed final lists of governments and organizations to be invited to IHC-19/A-1 and will submit those lists to Member States for approval as required by References A and B.
- 7. Nominations should reach the IHB by **15 August 2016**. The Directing Committee will consider a possible adjustment of the closing date if the revised Convention is approved by the required majority before that date.
