## 1. Opening

### 1.1 Opening Remarks by Hosts

The MACHC meeting was opened by Mr McClean Hobson, Director of Maritime Affairs, St Kitts and Nevis. He commented that St Kitts and Nevis has been a strong advocate for the development of Hydrography and as an Associate Member of the MACHC it was a privilege and honour to host the meeting and to welcome delegates to St Kitts.

He stated that there are many regional hydrographic challenges centered on Capacity Building, training and equipment needs. Mr Hobson also highlighted that Capacity Building and maintaining progress in the field of Hydrography contributes to the sustainability of the islands economic growth.

#### 1.2 Opening Remarks by the Chairman

MACHC chairman, Rear Admiral Nick Lambert (UK) welcomed delegates to the meeting and went on to thank the St Kittians for their remarkable hospitality and the government of St Kitts and Nevis for hosting the 12th meeting of the MACHC. He commented that the meeting was one of the largest Regional Hydrographic Commission gatherings; 25 countries and over 70 delegates.

He outlined the importance of understanding the contribution of Hydrography to the economic infrastructure of Islands States; ensuring the safe navigation of shipping, the ever increasing size of ships and the widening of the Panama Canal. The Admiral also highlighted that one of the successes of the Commission was to bring representatives from Governments, Industry and Commercial sectors together for a common purpose.

#### 1.3 Opening Remarks by Director IHB

Captain Alberto Costa-Neves, IHB, deputizing for Director Captain Hugo Gorziglia, explained the important role that RHCs perform at regional level and their influence with matters relating to SOLAS and the protection of the environment. He also commented on the requirement for Member States (MS) to approve the amendments to the convention on the IHO and applications by pending MS.

#### 1.4 Address by Chief Guest

The Right Honorable Dr Denzil Douglas, Prime Minister of St Kitts and Nevis, welcomed delegates to St Kitts and hoped that the meeting would be beneficial, in the light of the current global environment and the significant economic challenges.

He commented on the importance of MS governments to be fully engaged with the Hydrographic community in order to help protect the lives of people at sea and to find ways and means for

nations to become more involved with the economic activities of international maritime trade for both small and large vessels.

### 1.5 Agenda and Timetable approval

The Chairman introduced the Draft Agenda (MACHC12-01a) and Timetable (MACHC12-01b) and Members adopted the documents.

#### 1.6 List of Documents

The Chairman commented that delegates were expected to have downloaded the documents from the IHO Web site, as shown on the List of Documents (MACHC12-01c) and have brought them to the meeting.

#### 1.7 Administrative Arrangements

### 4. IHO / IHB Matters

The Chairman invited the IHB Representative to provide a general overview of the Organization and the Bureau activities

# 4.1 Status of the ratification of the protocol of amendments to the IHO Convention (Report by IHB).

The IHB commented that According to the information provided by the External Relations Department of the Government of Monaco, to date, 33 Member State Governments have formally notified their approval of the Protocol of Amendments to the Convention of IHO, as approved at the 3rd Extraordinary International Hydrographic Conference (EIHC) in April 2005.

# 4.2 MACHC to adopt objectives to accelerate the process of ratification of the protocol of amendments to the IHO Convention.

The IHB encouraged those representatives of Member States that have not yet approved the amendments to the Convention to actively follow up this matter with their government authorities.

# 4.3 MACHC to encourage the approval of pending applications for IHO membership.

The IHB commented that Montenegro, Haiti and Vietnam have applied for membership but have not yet obtained the required number of approvals from Member States. Those IHO Member States, whose Governments have not yet approved the applications made by these three countries, are urged to actively encourage their Government authorities to consider doing so as soon as possible.

# 4.4 Status of pending Member States in the region for depositing the instrument of Accession.

The meeting was informed that Mauritania, Bulgaria, Cameroon and Sierra Leone, whose application for membership has been approved, have not yet deposited their Instrument of Accession.

### 4.5 Forthcoming International Hydrographic Conference

The IHB encouraged Member States to attend the 18<sup>th</sup> International Hydrographic Conference in April 2012 and to be involved in discussions covering a wide range issues facing the international hydrographic community.

### 4.6 Update on encouragement to IHO suspended members to rejoin

The IHB urged Member States to undertake all necessary measures to encourage IHO suspended members to rejoin.

### 5. National Reports

Member States provided the meeting with summaries highlighting salient aspects of their National Reports. The full National Reports can be accessed on the IHO website.

There were a number of recurrent themes that developed from the summaries:

- The need for Capacity Building training and equipment
- Developing nations desire to improve economic infrastructure
- More coordinated and effective response to disasters
- Benefits of regional cooperation

# 6. MACHC Committees, Working Groups, and Commission Representatives Reports

MACHC committee and working group chairs reported to MACHC Members on discussions at closed session working group meetings earlier in the day.

#### 6.1 Electronic Chart Committee Working Group (ECC-WG)

Mr. Erich Frey (US), acting chair of the ECC-WG reported that ECC WG 1 will be disbanded as the work has been completed. He confirmed that the work of ECC WG 2 was ongoing and presented a comprehensive report on their activities, which is available on the IHO website (ECC-WG2 Report) <a href="http://www.iho-ohi.net/mtg">http://www.iho-ohi.net/mtg</a> docs/rhc/MACHC/MACHC12 under the 'presentations made during the meeting' link.

The chairman of the MACHC thanked the participants of the ECC-WG for their excellent work and several MACHC Member States endorsed the comments of the MACHC chair.

The ECC WG 2 report recommendations were as follows:

- 1. MACHC ECC continue to monitor and update Region B, Atlantic side, ENC scheme for all Usage Bands, per the timetables indicated in Annex A of the ECC WG 2 report.
- 2. MACHC ECC monitors and updates Region B, Pacific Ocean side, ENC scheme for all Usage Bands, per the timetables indicated in Annex A of the ECC WG 2 report.

• The important work of the International Bathymetric Chart of the Caribbean Sea and the Gulf of Mexico and the areas of responsibility of IBCCA members.

### 7.9 RTCM (Radio Technical Commission for Maritime Services)

# 8. Strategy to involve non-Member States in RHC's activities

There was general agreement by Member States with the inclusive approach taken by current and previous MACHC Chairs to involve non-Member States with RHC activities.

# 9. Experience in dealing with maritime disasters in relation with IHO guidelines

Capt John Lowell (US) gave a comprehensive presentation on NOAA's experience in dealing with marine hazard responses, which is available on the IHO website (Presentations made during the meeting – Emergency Response) and highlighted:

- Why Hydrographic Offices (HO) respond to marine hazards
- Distinct types of hazard responses
- Examples of domestic and international responses.

The presentation generated Member State support for HO engagement on hazard responses and highlighted the requirement for HO participation in the field of hazard prevention and associated warning systems related to storms, hurricanes and tsunamis.

### 10. Marine Spatial Data Infrastructure (MSDI)

Capt Gerd Lang (US) presented an 'overview of MSDI' on behalf of Maureen Kenny, Chair of the IHO Marine Spatial Data Infrastructure (MSDI) Working Group, which is available on the IHO website (Presentations made during the meeting – MACHC MSDI by NOAA) and highlighted:

- Benefits to hydrographic organizations of supporting a MSDI.
- Examples of MSDI at work.
- The MSDI guidance publication for Hydrographic Offices IHO C-17 Spatial Data Infrastructures: "The Marine Dimension".

The presentation generated discussion on the need to establish a regional MSDI for the MACHC. The MACHC Chair suggested that the name of the regional MSDI should reflect the broad nature of maritime activities in the region with special emphasis on the economic reliance that smaller island states have on the marine environment. Member States agreed to name their regional MSDI as the Meso-American and Caribbean (MAC) 'Marine Economic Infrastructure Programme (MEIP)'.

UK volunteered to chair the MAC MEIP WG to discuss with interested parties in the margins of the meeting how to define the use and purpose of a regional MSDI and to exchange thoughts on the 'Terms of Reference' for the WG. It was agreed that members of the MEIP WG would progress their work during the year by correspondence and telephone conference calls.

Raphael Ponce, ESRI gave a presentation on ideas for a regional MSDI, such as the MEIP, which is available on the IHO website (Presentations made during the meeting – Marine Infrastructure program by ESRI) and highlighted:

 An industry perspective of MSDI with examples of MSDI and some suggestions for the MAC MEIP MSDI.

# 11. Status of Hydrographic Surveying and Nautical Charting Worldwide C-55

The IHB representative gave an overview of the use and nature of C-55 and how to find the publication on the IHO website - <a href="http://www.iho.int/iho\_pubs/CB/C-55">http://www.iho.int/iho\_pubs/CB/C-55</a> Bruno Frachon, (FR)

commented that there was a strong link between C-55 and MSDI, and perhaps the C-55 data should form a base layer to a regional MSDI (MAC MEIP).

### 11.1 Development of C-55

Jeff Bryant gave a presentation on the development of C-55 since IRCC3, which is available on the IHO website (Presentations made during the meeting – MACHC C-55 Development) and highlighted:

- The requirement to improve the presentation and quality of worldwide hydrographic and surveying and nautical charting information in the light of wider developments and use of MSDI.
- A Baltic Sea Hydrographic Commission (BSHC) solution and suggested way forward.

This topic was raised as a proposal and discussed at the 18<sup>th</sup> International Hydrographic Conference.

# 12. Crowd Sourcing (CS) Survey Techniques

Presentations by Paul Cooper (CARIS) and Rafel Ponce (Esri) on Crowd Sourcing.

The IHO stated that the IMO currently has Voluntary Observing Ships and suggested that we may be able to use these for CS. CARIS commented that the data needs evaluating as it is still an emerging technology and needs to be compared to existing recent data to ensure accuracy.

The US stated that they are very interested in CS but are concerned about the liability issues of using the data. The quality of CS data will need to be communicated to the user.

FR stated that CS is complementary information to supplement existing data but they have concerns about the lack of tidal correction. The process is similar to what happened years ago when mariners sent their logbooks to the Hydrographic Office (HO) for inclusion in HO products. It will provide a way to identify previously undetected underwater features that could be investigated further by more conventional means - liability means that we cannot just ignore the data.

BVI acknowledged the benefits of CS but had reservations about SOLAS compliancy of the data.

Chair stated that CS is nothing new; it is used regularly in HCA region in the form of "Mud Maps"

FR said maybe it should require IHB specification for the data collected.

See action at Agenda item 11.

### 13. Satellite Bathymetry

Presentation by Celine Roux (FR) explaining the process of obtaining depths from satellite imagery.

IHB stated that it would be good to use in areas where we currently have no data and asked if in time the technology would achieve S-44 Order 1A? France stated that they would expect it to

reach Order 1B - but not yet. The use of ground truthing means the horizontal datum is Order 1A but currently only a 5m resolution +/- 2m.

UK is currently actively researching the accuracy and use of SB and is looking at obtaining satellite data for the Bahamas where a recent multibeam survey have been carried out for comparison.

US enquired why only certain waters were acceptable. FR stated that the clarity of water and seabed characteristics effect the depths that are obtainable.

# 15. Discussions from Stakeholder Day

The key output from the event was the establishment of the Meso-American and Caribbean Marine Economic Infrastructure Programme Working Group (MACMEIP-WP). This Marine Spatial Planning initiative should better assist regional cooperation with the exchange of maritime and shipping/economic infrastructure information.

The topics and discussions at the Stakeholder Day highlighted the need for Hydrographer's to take account of the views of ship masters and shipping companies – the users. We were also reminded about the role of IMO and forthcoming mandatory IMO Member State Audit Scheme. Finally, there was general agreement by Member States and Observers that the Stakeholder Day was a success and, at times, the source of invigorated debate at MACHC plenary.

# 16. Any Other Business

There were no topics raised under any other business.

# 17. Date and Venue of the next meeting

Guatemala offered to host the next meeting, which was supported by US and seconded by SR and BR. Member States agreed that the meeting should take place during November or December 2013. Guatemala was duly appointed host for the next MACHC meeting subject to official approval by Guatemala.

### 18. Election of Chair and Vice Chair

The MACHC Chair invited Member Stated to ratify UK as Chair for a further year, as agreed in the MACHC Statutes. US supported the proposal, which was seconded by Brazil. UK was duly appointed Chair of the MACHC for a second year.

# 19. Approval of the Action List

The draft actions were agreed by Member States and are attached at Annex B.

20. Closing Remarks from the Chair
The MACHC Chair gave heartfelt thanks to St Kitts – our hosts, the Vice Chair, Member States, Observers from organisations and companies, hotel staff and conference staff for their support and valued contributions to the MACHC meeting plenary sessions, working group and committee meetings and Stakeholder and Industry days. He then formally closed the meeting.
