

Generic reasons for New Editions/New Charts

- New navigationally significant data too large for NtoM
- Horizontal positional inaccuracies
- New/changed IMO adopted routeing measures
- New port developments/ traffic movements

All to ensure the safety of the mariner





 - This in turn will provide essential information for spatial planning, sustainable use of marine resources, marine conservation and ensure safe navigation at sea.
