Subject: MACHC Capacity Building Work Program: Seminar on Raising Awareness of Hydrography (St. John's, Antigua and Barbuda, 7-8 December 2015)

Dear Colleagues,

- 1. The 2015 Capacity Building Work Programme of the International Hydrographic Organisation (IHO) provides support for a regional seminar on *Raising Awareness of Hydrography*. The objective of the seminar is to provide participants with an understanding of the obligations and the governance requirements of providing a national hydrographic service and how best a coastal State can meet its international obligations in providing those services.
- 2. Accordingly, a seminar will be held in St. John's (Antigua and Barbuda) from 7 to 8 December 2015. The seminar will precede the 16th meeting of the Meso-American Caribbean Sea Hydrographic Commission (MACHC) that will be held from 8 to 12 December 2015 at the same venue. Outline details of the seminar are provided at Annex A.
- 3. The International Maritime Organization (IMO) and the International Association of Marine Aids to Navigation and Lighthouse Authorities (IALA) are being invited to participate in the seminar together with the IHO, as part of the UN "deliver as one" initiative.

Working Language

4. All seminar presentations will be delivered in English. However, Antigua and Barbuda, as hosts, and Mexico intend to arrange continuous interpretation in Spanish if required.

Follow-on Meeting

5. Participants in the seminar are encouraged to remain in St. John's on completion of the seminar and to attend the 16th MACHC to consolidate the knowledge gained during the seminar and to experience how an IHO Regional Hydrographic Commission (RHC) functions in the regional delivery of hydrographic services. In addition, the combination of attendance at the seminar and attendance at the MACHC meeting will provide an excellent opportunity to establish or strengthen existing professional networks.

Funding Arrangements

- All meals, accommodation and travel for the seminar will be paid by the IHO Capacity Building Fund for ONE participant per country. However, please note that accommodation will only be paid for the period 7 to 8 December (3 full board hotel fees, allowing for arrival on 6 December). Participants or their sponsoring organizations are expected to pay for the hotel fees for the four additional days of the MACHC meeting on 9 to 12 December (480 US Dollars, assuming departure on 12 December). This means that the total expense, including travel for each participant in both the seminar and the MACHC will be 480 US Dollars.
- Please note that no monetary allowances will be paid directly to participants. Any associated 7. expenses beyond the meals, accommodation and travel provided by the CB Fund, such as travel insurance, pocket money and visa fees must be covered by the candidate or the candidate's organization.

Nominations and Eligibility Criteria

- Coastal States in the MACHC region are invited to consider nominating ONE suitable national representative who will benefit from the opportunity of attending the seminar and the subsequent MACHC meeting.
- It is essential that nominees are employed by a national hydrographic office, a maritime 9. authority or a related national agency in the nominating country and are in a position to influence the development of the national hydrographic infrastructure. In this respect, a statement indicating the role of the nominee in the national hydrographic infrastructure is required as part of the application process.

Application Procedure

- Applications to attend the seminar should be sent, by email, using the accompanying Application Form (at Annex B) and the statement referred in paragraph 8, to Steve Barnett, (email address: steve.barnett@ukho.gov.uk with copy to adcc@iho.int), no later than 28th August. It is important that the application form is completed electronically and returned as an Excel file or in an Excel-compatible format.
- In order to enable the purchase of e-tickets to selected participants, application forms should be accompanied by a copy of the applicant's passport and a reliable e-mail address for confirmation of acceptance for the seminar and the forwarding of ticketing details.
- Please note that if participants require a visa in order to attend the seminar they should apply 12. as soon as they are accepted on the Seminar.
