4 NIOHC Statutes

Article 13 of the Statutes state:

Members and Associate Members of the Commission may propose amendments to the present Statutes. These amendments shall be discussed at a Conference and the decisions, which must be approved by two-thirds (2/3) majority of the Members of the Commission and will be included in the Report of the Conference.

4.1 NIOHC Membership Applications

States eligible for Observer, Associate or Member status will be invited to the meeting and if they wish a change of membership status will make themselves known at this point.

Sudan has indicated to the chair that they wish to become Associate Members of the NIOHC. Member states are invited to note this indication for discussion.

Article 5 of the Statutes state:

"g) Countries within the region who are not Members or Associate Members of the Commission, as well as countries which are outside the region and are Members of the International Hydrographic Organization, but not Associate Members of the NIOHC, if they contribute to the safety of navigation by their activities in the fields of hydrography including training, nautical charting, or nautical information in the region of the NIOHC area, and those organizations, which are active in the region of the NIOHC area in the fields of hydrography, including training, nautical charting, nautical information or aids to navigation, can be invited to send representatives to attend its meetings, as observers. The observers may take part in the discussion but shall not have voting rights.

h) Coordinators of adjacent INT chart regions and the countries bordering the region, who are not Members or Associate Members of the Commission, can be invited to send representatives to attend its meetings, as observers. The observers may take part in the discussions but shall not have voting rights."

8.2 General Bathymetric Chart of the Oceans (GEBCO)

Rochelle Wigley, GEBCO, will attend the NIOHC and to discuss the regional mapping initiatives.

The GEBCO consists of an international group of experts who work on the development of a range of bathymetric data sets and data products, including gridded bathymetric data sets, the GEBCO Digital Atlas, the GEBCO world map and the GEBCO Gazetteer of Undersea Feature Names.

When needed, GEBCO will initiate its own regional bathymetric mapping projects, drawing on the expertise and regional knowledge of local experts including GEBCO colleagues and in particular the GEBCO/Nippon Foundation Scholars.

8.3 International Association of Lighthouse Authorities (IALA)

Jean-Charles Leclair, Dean of the IALA World-Wide Academy will provide a presentation on the work of IALA.

IALA is a non-profit, international technical association. Established in 1957, it enables marine aids to navigation authorities, manufacturers, consultants, and, scientific and training institutes from all parts of the world to exchange and compare their experiences, achievements, and technical and operational policies via participation in IALA Technical Committees. The Committees work to create IALA Recommendations and Guidelines which are recognised worldwide as the international standards for the implementation and operation of aids to navigation. These standards help to ensure that the movements of vessels are safe, expeditious, cost effective and harmless to the environment.

IALA's scope and expertise extends to e-Navigation and Vessel Traffic Services.

The IALA World-Wide Academy is an established arm of IALA and has responsibility for training and capacity building.

8.4 Regional Organization for the Conservation of the Environment of the Red Sea and Gulf of Aden (PERSGA)

Islam Taha, Coordinator of the PERSGA GIS and Information Technology unit will attend and present on PERSGA's programs and activities, in the conservation of the marine environment in PERSGA region.

PERSGA, is an intergovernmental body dedicated to the conservation of the coastal and marine environments found in the Red Sea, Gulf of Aqaba, Gulf of Suez, Suez Canal, and Gulf of Aden surrounding the Socotra Archipelago and nearby waters.

8.5 Combined Maritime Forces (CMF)

Cdr Will Peters RN (Deputy Director Plans) for Combined Maritime Forces in Bahrain will talk on Counter Piracy operations and wider maritime security issues in the Indian Ocean.

CMF is a multi-national naval partnership, which exists to promote security, stability and prosperity across approximately 2.5 million square miles of international waters, which encompass some of the world's most important shipping lanes.

Article 4 states: "The Commission shall meet annually, in ordinary Conference, within the region."

Article 5 a states: "At the end of each Conference, the Members desirous of hosting the following Conference shall put forward their candidatures. Priority shall be given to a country, which has not yet hosted a Conference, or to the one, which did so the longest time ago. In cases of equal priority a ballot shall be held, the decisions being taken by a simple majority of Members present. The Chairman shall take up his duties within four months from the end of the Conference.

20 Election of Chair and Vice Chair

Members are invited to consider the election of the new Chair and Vice Chair as per articles 1 d and e.

Article 1 d states: "Associate Members shall have the same rights and obligations as the Members of the Commission, except the right to vote or be elected Chairman."

Article 1 e states: "At the conclusion of the Conference the Vice Chairman for the next Conference shall be elected and shall take up his duties within four months following the Conference. He shall remain in office until the end of the next Conference. In the normal course of events the Vice Chairman will succeed as the Chairman at the conclusion of the next Conference."
